... Higher Operating Costs Subdue Profitability

Event

UACN Plc ('UACN' or 'the Group'), in its recently released Q3 2022 earnings results, reported a 4% year-on-year (YoY) revenue growth, from N24.87bn in Q3 2021 to N25.76bn in Q3 2022. The weak revenue growth despite price increases across products suggests pressures on volume during the period. We believe that consumer demand declined in Q3 2022, on the back of weak purchasing power due to heightened inflationary pressures.

Driven by rising raw material costs, slow revenue growth, and higher operating expenses, the Group incurred an operating loss of N1.34bn in Q3 2022. In the same vein, loss after tax worsened to N1.31bn in Q3 2022 from a loss of N199mn in Q3 2021.

Segmental Performance

Animal Feed and Other Edibles

Revenue grew marginally by 1% to N15.03bn in Q3 2022 from N14.90bn in Q3 2021. The lean revenue growth was on the back of lower volume sales amid price increases to offset rising cost and competitive pressures. Lower volume sales were recorded in poultry feed, fish feed, and oil products categories. The segment recorded a N1.90bn loss before tax (Q3 2021: profit before tax of N210mn). The loss was driven by higher operating expense and higher finance cost.

Paints

Riding on her market leadership status with the ability to transfer cost burden to consumers, the paint segment revenue grew by 24% YoY to N4.32bn from N3.47bn in Q3 2021.

Operating profit grew 8x to N560mn from N59mn in Q3 2021. The performance was the effect of higher pricing and improved volume sales which partially offset raw material cost and operating expenses. Furthermore, profit before tax grew by 1% to N623mn from N90mn recorded in Q3 2021.

Packages Food and Beverages

Revenue declined by 6% to N5.51bn in Q3 2021 from N5.85bn in Q3 2021. Lower volume sales in snacks, diaries and water categories accounted for the decline. Buoyed by higher input cost and increased expenses, the segment recorded an operating loss of N98.00mn. Also, loss before tax was N57.00mn from a profit before tax position of N226mn recorded in Q3 2021.

QSR

In the QSR segment, revenue increased by 43% YoY to N845mn in Q3 2022 (Q3 2021: N590mn). The growth was majorly driven by increased capacity, as the Group launched additional company-owned stores during the period.



The segment recorded a N163mn operating loss in Q3 2022 (Q3 2021: N104mn loss), as a result of higher cost of sales which driven by higher raw material costs, distribution expenses, and store pre-opening investments (i.e., rent, training). The QSR segment recorded a N213mn loss before tax in Q3 2022, compared to a N127mn loss before tax in Q3 2021.

Outlook

Due to the competitive nature of their industry amid rising input costs pressures, we expect weak revenue growth in the Animal Feeds segment

We expect weak household purchasing power, owing to heightened inflationary pressures to negatively impact topline growth in the Food and Beverages segment. Hence, we also expect to see weak revenue growth in this segment.

We believe that the Paint and QSR segments will maintain their revenue growth momentum into Q4 2022, but the impact of slower growth in the Animal Feeds and Food and Beverages segments will dampen the Group's overall topline performance. For context, Animal Feeds and Food and Beverages segment account for an average of 74% of the Group's total revenue.

Overall, we expect the Company incur a net loss in FY 2022 following their weak quarterly financial performance and weak growth expectations in the near term. However, we maintain a dividend estimate of 65 kobo. We posit that the Group's cash levels are sufficient to pay dividends.

Our fair value estimate for the stock is N5.78. At the current market price, the stock trades at a premium of 39% and offers a dividend yield of 7%. This sums up to a total negative return of 32%, hence we recommend a **SELL**.
