... Pricing Power Boosts Profitability

July 22, 2025 Earnings Note


#### **Event**

Dangote Cement Plc ("the Group") started the 2025 fiscal year under challenging macroeconomic and market conditions, with pressure on its volume causing a strategic reliance on pricing actions to drive top-line performance. Specifically, revenue grew by 22% to N994.66 billion in Q1 2025 (Q1 2024: N817.35 billion), primarily underpinned by aggressive pricing optimisation in the Nigerian market.

On the volume front, a 7% decline to 6.60Mt was reported in Q1 2025 (Q1 2024: 7.04Mta), reflecting contraction across both the Nigerian and Pan African markets. In Nigeria - which is the Group's largest market, volume dipped by 4% to 4.40Mta (Q1 2024: 4.59 Mta), reversing the volume rebound reported in the market last year. According to management, this contraction was due to a slowdown in real estate and private construction projects. Despite this, revenue from the Nigerian market grew by 54% to N696.04 billion (Q1 2024: N452.92 billion), driven by effective price increases.

Across the Pan-African market, volume remained pressured, down by 10% to 2.44 Mta (Q1 2024: 2.71Mta). This was due to prolonged post-election uncertainties in Senegal and South Africa, and liquidity constraints in Ethiopia due to delayed national budget approval. Although the Tanzania and Cameroon markets volume grew by 31.7% and 0.60%, respectively, the gains were insufficient to offset the broader regional declines. Consequently, Pan-African revenue contracted by 15% to N322.65 billion (Q1 2024: N381.27 billion).

The cost of goods grew marginally by just 2% to N407.27 billion (Q1 2024: N398.16 billion). In our view, the slower growth in the total cost was largely due to the lower volume sales, as the material consumed (21% of total cost) declined by 11% to N87.06 billion (Q1 2024: N98.20 billion), while fuel and power consumed (44% of total cost) dropped 3%. Hence, gross profit surged by 40% to N587.40 billion (Q1 2024: N419.19 billion), and gross margin expanded by 800 basis points to 59% (Q1 2024: 51%).



Operating expenses (opex) growth also moderated, with selling and distribution expenses (75% of total opex) growing by just 6% to N153.64 billion (Q1 2024: N145.26 billion). This modest growth can be attributed to the combination of volume declines and benefits of CNG truck adoption. According to management, additional 1,500 full CNG trucks were acquired during the quarter, further enhancing logistic efficiency. Administrative expenses (25% of total opex) was up by 14%, due to higher salaries and staff cost. Overall, operating expense growth remained in single digits, up by 8% to N205.48 billion (Q1 2024: N190.79 billion), and operating margin contracted by 300 basis points to 21% (Q1 2024: 23%).

On the back of slower growth in input and operating cost, operating profit surged by 56% to N398.18 billion (Q1 2024: N255.94 billion), and operating margin expanded by 900 basis points to 40% (Q1 2024: 31%).

Elevated interest rate continued to impact the Group's borrowings negatively, fueling an 88% jump in finance cost to N111.90 billion (Q1 2024: N59.46 billion). Although, the elevated rate also resulted in a sharp rise of 193% in finance income, it was eclipsed by the finance cost growth, driving net finance costs higher by 63% to N78.55 billion (Q1 2024: N48.07 billion).

On the foreign exchange front, stability prevailed, and losses narrowed significantly by 73% to N17.47 billion (Q1 2024: N63.77 billion). This helped reduce the non-operating expenses by 4% to N86.21 billion (Q1 2024: N89.54 billion). This decline, coupled with robust operating profit, culminated in an impressive 87% year-on-year growth in profit before tax. Despite a 91% rise in tax charges, profit after tax still grew by 86% to N209.25 billion (Q1 2024: N112.67 billion).

### **Outlook**

As the Nigeria economy continues to improve in 2025, we expect to see progress in real estate and private construction sector, and this is anticipated to drive volume growth in the market. We also anticipate recovery in the Pan African market volume sales, as temporary factors that impacted some countries in the region ease over the course of the year.

Accordingly, we revise our fair value for the stock upward to N480.59 (previously: N457.55). While the stock currently trades at N489.00 which is a premium to our fair value, we project a dividend yield of 7% for the stock resulting in a total return of 5%. Hence, we retain our **HOLD** recommendation for the stock.
